God being faithful, He will succor us and guide us into purpose and peace. It is human to seek comfort over forcing spiritual growthm, but spiritual growth is essential to living beyond the ashes.

The seasons of fire may cause one to experience despair and pain and to say such things as this is unfair of God and is more than reasonable for me to have to experience as a Christian, but God knows what we are able to bare and promises not to allow anything to press us beyond our strength boundaries <u>I Cor. 10:13</u>. Believe God for the Kingdom of heaven suffereth violence and the violent take it by force. <u>Matt 11:13</u>. We must fight the good fight of faith to lay hold on eternal life <u>1.Tim 6:12</u>.
